Teacher Update Moreh Ari

I like to teach about Tu Bishvat with the windows closed. We can look at pictures of trees and fresh fruit and talk about the joyous anticipation of the bloom of the Shkediya, marking Spring's imminent arrival. And we can forget about the blizzard and the polar vortex.

Tu Bishvat at TT is a big deal. The JNF campaign usually kicks off around the same time as the Hebrew and Judaic Studies teachers turn their attention to the holiday, and there is learning and enthusiasm all the way to the schoolwide Tu Bishvat Seder. Indeed, working on the JNF campaign and the schoolwide Seder are some of my favourite responsibilities at the school.

The campaign started with a chance for me to reconnect with some students I haven't taught in class for a few years. I gathered the interested Grade 6 students and introduced them to this year's cause: rejuvenation and expansion of Israel's Segev Forest. We talked about why it was important, how we were going to make it meaningful for students, and what they would be responsible for while leading the fundraiser.

The team ended up creating a song, making a promotional video, a video demonstrating one of the leaders phoning their savta to ask her to buy a tree, and a thank you video to all those who contributed to raising over \$4500 that month. They also did administrative tasks and made presentations to each class, answering questions about the Segev Forest, the JNF, and the Tu Bishvat campaign procedures. Hopefully this experience will make the "tree leaders" comfortable participating in other charitable endeavours throughout their lives.

Then the day came! It was the 15th of Shvat, and all the students gathered in the lunchroom. A small but passionate team of volunteers had set up individual plates of grapes, orange slices, olives, and Oreos, and grape juice was at every table. The teachers assigned several students from each grade to sit at each table, and the older kids helped the younger ones pour grape juice, find their place in the reader, and explain what they needed to do.

Moreh Ben led a sing-along of Tu Bishvat songs, Grade 1 students performed "Inch by Inch," and Grade 6 students explained on the microphone about the different parts of the ceremony. I remember when the current Grade 6 students were the ones having grape juice poured for them, and I look forward to watching the current little ones pour grape juice for my kids soon enough.

I hope it was a wonderful holiday for everyone and that real spring will indeed soon arrive. In the meantime, Chag Purim Sameach!

The first leg of relay runners are staggered in their starting positions. The pistol is fired, sending the runners flying around the track. The crowd is on their feet, roaring, cheering. The runners bank around the turn, sprinting down the line where the second leg of runners are waiting. The first runners approach, handing off the batons to the second leg of runners already in motion.

This is not the Olympics. It's the Running Room 43rd Annual Indoor Games.

The morning starting out with 13 Talmud Torah student athletes spanning grades 3-6, 2 teachers/coaches, and a handful of parents gathering in the giant yellow Universiade Pavilion better known as the Butterdome. We got first pick of bleacher seating and spread out, making ourselves comfortable. Ms. Kovacs pulled out a small backpack and pulled out piles of T-shirts repurposed from the old junior high and shorts for the student athletes to change into. They came back looking like a real team, sporting matching black T-shirts with blue stripping down the sleeves, emblazoned with the fierce images of the TT lion and Torah scroll. Coffee was located (for the adults) and the kids started digging into their first set of snacks.

Large contingents from the other schools started to arrive in droves, and soon the bleachers were packed to the brim with elementary school students from across Edmonton. The student athletes represented a diverse group, spanning all races, cultures, and sizes (some looked like they could be teenagers!). Some runners wore hijabs, and others, full length skirts. The runners poured out onto the track for a "warmup" sprint before the day's events kicked off. Their nervous excitement was palpable.

Our first event was the mixed 8X200 meter relay. I was glad that Moreh Ari was wearing a pink shirt, so we could follow when their group of 56 runners (8 runners/school X 7 schools/heat) were herded from one staging area to the next. When it was finally time for their heat, the runners lined up on the track like pros, and the rest of the TT kids, parents, and Ms. Kovacs moved up to the barricade to cheer on each runner as they came by. I had only heard about the legendary speed of "Grade 6 Jack", but let me tell you, the rumors are true! We finished 3rd fastest out of the 13 schools that participated in the relay.

All in all, 13 student athletes from our small school completed in the 8X200 mixed relay, the girls and boys 200 meter dash, the boys 800 meter run, and the girls and boys long jump. Shai came in 3rd in the girls long jump, and Jack placed 1st in the boys long jump! It was so exciting watching these kids compete with confidence and hold their own.

It was heartwarming to see these kids come together, build community, cheer each other on, and celebrate each other's successes. I have no doubts that they created life-long memories, and I hope many are inspired to continue their journeys in track and field. Huge thank you to Ms. Kovacs and Moreh Ari for giving their time, training our student athletes (over months of recesses), and coordinating such a fun event!

Pink Shirt Day

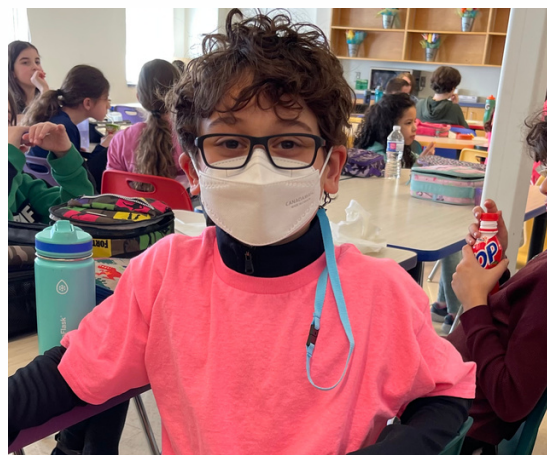

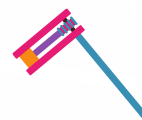

Talmud Torah School (TT) is well known for its cohesive community and familial nature. In any given year we average around 140 students, and an additional 60 children in the Talmud Torah Early Learning Centre. For the 2022-23 school year we wanted our students to experience the creation and performance of a drama production. Talmud Torah School Council (TTSC), through the efforts of Chair Christina Reboh and TTSC parent volunteers, Talmud Torah Society's Education Committee, as well as principal Darin Johnson, were able to bring Trickster Theatre to Talmud Torah School. Trickster Theatre is a non-profit organization that creates fun, engaging, effective learning through physical theatre.

Throughout the week of February 13, teachers had the unique opportunity to be inspired by Trickster Theatre artists and learned new techniques to their cross-curricular, Judaic inspired drama/art projects. Our students took the lead with just one prop and three 1.5 hour sessions. Along with techniques taught by Trickster Theatre leaders, students learned about script writing, artistic collaboration, costume design, stage presence and lighting, lessons which will be valuable for years to come.

Our community had a special opportunity to come together at TT the evening of February 16th and the afternoon of February 17th to see the students demonstrate our values on stage:

KG – act with loving kindness, show your love through kind actions:

Gr. 1 – help your community grow by showing kindness and helping all people who share things in common with you;

Gr. 2 – be content, be happy with what you have;

Gr. 3 – use your words to help and be kind – if you don't have something nice to say, don't say it at all;

Gr. 4 – every person has great value and deserves to be treated with respect;

Gr. 5 – take care of the world, show how much you love it, by helping to clean it and working toward fixing any problems you might find;

Gr. 6 – shadow show bringing together all the Jewish values performed.

The gymnasium was filled with family and friends, along with special guests including MLA Lorne Dach, Edmonton Public School Trustee Dawn Hancock, and Jewish Federation CEO Stacey Leavitt Wright.

Our students worked very hard to prepare skits that were not only entertaining, but oftentimes humorous and heartwarming.

It culminated in an outstanding, spine-tingling performance by the Grade 6 students done solely with shadows and music. Not a word was spoken, but the messages were loud and clear.

Parent volunteers worked throughout the week, schlepping stage equipment, creating props for the Grade 6 performance, organizing costumes, and helping during the performances. As always, our amazing volunteers came through with flying colours! This drama residency could not have been achieved without a generous grant from the Edmonton Jewish Community Charitable Foundation (EJCCF). In providing the grant, the EJCCF recognized the importance of drama in school, specifically drama with a Judaic theme. "The Edmonton Jewish Community Charitable Foundation provides grants every year to the Talmud Torah Society that support student enrichment. They are an integral part of our ability to enhance the student experience at TT, and we are so very thankful", Christina stated. As well, many parents and community members supported this residency by placing greetings or business ads in the playbill.

Thank you to all of our volunteers and sponsors for your efforts in bringing this special drama experience to Talmud Torah students and staff.

Rabbi Guy believes that the future of the Jewish community in Edmonton depends on its Jewish education, and that knowledge of the Torah and the tradition must be taught from early age until the last day.

His own children attend AJP and are loving the program!

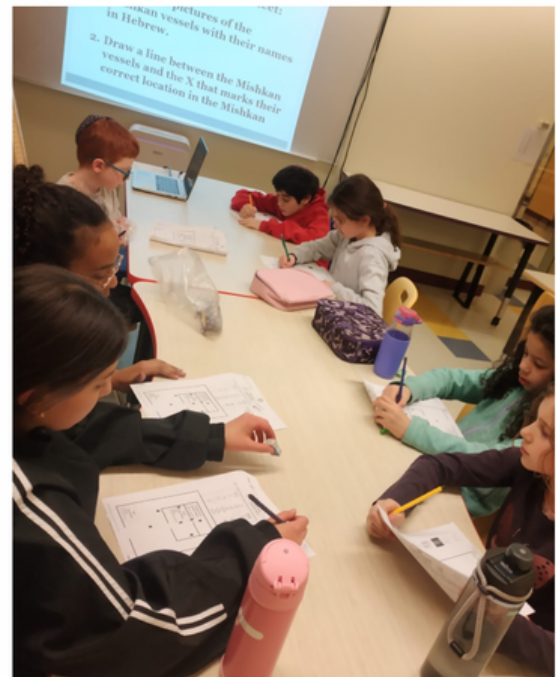
