Message from the Society Board Leeor Eliyahu, 2022-23 Past President

Hello TTS family!!

I hope that everyone has been enjoying the wonderful June weather. I will provide a few updates for everyone as we transition into summer vacation. The Society board has been working hard the past few months, especially in preparation for the AGM. The AGM was a wonderful success with about 60 people attending in person. It was our first in-person AGM in 3 years! Welcome to our new board members, Kelly Goldford and Mark MacLean and welcome back to Michelle Huberman! Thank you to Jen Coppens who completed her term this June for her years of dedication and service to the community, your presence will be missed on the board. Mazal Tov to Noga Vaisblat on her presidency election for the 2023- 2024 year!

Our Grade 6 class had their Shabbaton in May. It was a beautiful weekend filled with learning, fun, excitement and sleepless nights. Thank you to the committee of parents who pulled off such a memorable weekend for our graduates. We have already started planning for next year's Shabbaton.

The Society has worked very hard with Principal Darin Johnson to discuss and collaborate about the needs of the school for next year. There are a variety of areas that the Society's top up funding for the 2023 – 2024 year will affect the school for the better. Committed funds from the Society will go to support increased instructional minutes in the day, as well as more instructional days in the year. There are 174 instructional days next year, which is an increase of two days from this year. Overall hours of instruction will be at 1010 hours for the year, which is well above the provincial minimum of 950 hours. We are supporting 2.3 FTE of Judaic Studies and Hebrew Language Arts teaching time. The Society is also supporting the regrouping of grade 2 students into two classes for their Hebrew Language Arts, English Language Arts and Math subjects. Next year's grade 5 and 6 classes will be in a combined, except for their Math, Social Studies and Science lessons. In addition, we will be supporting literacy intervention instruction time, as well as maintaining our current EA supports, who provide invaluable support to the teachers and students in their classrooms.

Over the past couple of years, the board has received multiple inquiries about the possibility of re-opening the Junior High program. As we are an EPSB school, this is not simply a decision of the TTS board. In order to gauge interest within the school prior to truly engaging EPSB in these discussions, we undertook an interest survey. We received 65 responses, which accounts for 100 students currently enrolled in the school from K-6. Of those 100 kids, 65 are within division 1 and 35 in division 2. A total of 52 responses were in favour of sending their children to a TT Junior High, 38 responded that they weren't interested and 10 were unsure. This is a great first step of engagement within the community and I will leave it in the capable hands of next year's executive to engage EPSB and discuss this further.

I just wanted to take a moment to thank the community for trusting me and providing me with the opportunity to lead the Society over the past 3 years. It has been an honour and a privilege and I know that the Society is in very capable hands with Noga Vaisblat and the new executive at the helm. Please reach out to me, Noga or Natalie with any feedback, questions or concerns you may have.

Upcoming Casino We need you!



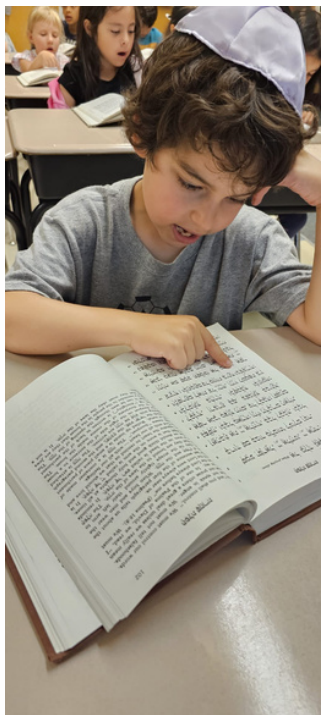
Talmud Torah Society's upcoming casino is Sunday, October, 22 and Monday, October 23 at Grand Villa Casino, and we need your help to ensure its success!

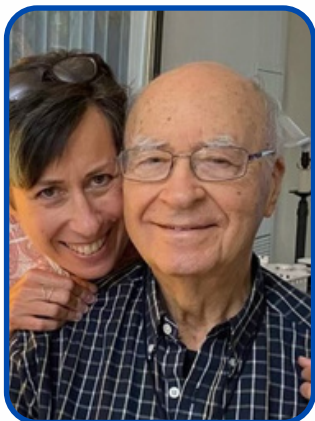

Alumni Highlight

Our alumni are important to us. If you are an alumni, we would love to know what you have been up to since graduating from Talmud Torah School. This issue highlights alumnus David Birenbaum, Class of 1943.



I was born in Edmonton in 1932 and we lived on 112 St and 99 Ave. I attended the Edmonton Talmud Torah school located at 103 St., just south of Jasper Ave. I remember being taught half-day of the English curriculum and half-day of Hebrew, which is something that I never questioned - it was just the way it was.

My experience at Talmud Torah was positive in all aspects. It was an integral part of my professional and family life. However, I did not stay connected in a meaningful way with any of my classmates, although Mel Hurtig z"l was the exception, as we were also neighbours growing up.

I have lived in Toronto since the late 1950s, although my parents remained in Edmonton for the rest of their lives. I have two daughters who were born and raised in Toronto (Natalie and Rona). My eldest daughter, Natalie, moved to Edmonton right after getting married to her husband, Ken, who had been living in Toronto for almost three years. Her husband, Ken, is a Class of 1969 Grade 6 graduate of Talmud Torah at the Glenora location.

It does my heart good that not only did I benefit from a fine education at Talmud Torah, but both my Edmonton granddaughters, Marlee Soroka (Class of 2010) and Jenna Soroka (Class of 2012) attended there from pre-school to Grade 9. In fact, my first-born granddaughter, Marlee, just finished her second year of teaching at Talmud Torah.

I attended the University of Alberta earning a BSc in Electrical Engineering in 1954. One of my former Engineering Professors was David Panar z"l, who years earlier had taken a sabbatical to actively participate in Israel's 1948 War of Independence. After graduation, I was accepted for a fellowship to train in England from 1954-1956. Upon returning to Canada, I moved to Toronto and spent most of my career as a partner with the Toronto mechanical and electrical consulting engineering firm, ECE Group (originally formed in 1955), whose founding principals were Jewish. I was the President of the firm until my retirement at age 65. My biggest accomplishment as President was to make the firm 100% employee owned. ECE acquired a considerable reputation for award-winning work. Notable projects include landmarks such as the National Art Gallery of Canada, the National Archives of Canada, and the Toronto Eaton Centre.

I have been retired for 25 years and enjoy living in in Toronto with my beautiful wife, Hyla. We enjoy it when our daughter, Natalie, visits us (sometimes with Marlee and Jenna) and gives us updates on what's happening at Talmud Torah School. I'm always interested in hearing how Talmud Torah is doing, and pleased that it is strong and viable, 111 years after it was first established in 1912. Living in Toronto it was very expensive, even back then, to send your child to private Hebrew schools. This was one of the reasons my daughters only attended a Sunday Hebrew school. Today, it is over-the-top expensive at any of the private Hebrew day schools in Toronto. When I learned that my granddaughters were going to be attending Talmud Torah School, I was thrilled knowing they would be getting an exceptional Judaic and Hebrew education, along with an equally wonderful education through Edmonton Public Schools. Jewish families in Edmonton are very lucky that they can send their children to a Jewish public school at such a low cost.

Anne Frank Memorial

Talmud Torah's Gr. 6 students participated in a ceremony on June 12th at Light House Park honouring what would have been Anne Frank's 94th birthday. Gr. 6 Social Studies teacher Ben Ragosin, Principal Darin Johnson, along with Natalie Soroka from the Society, were there to be a part of the ceremony.

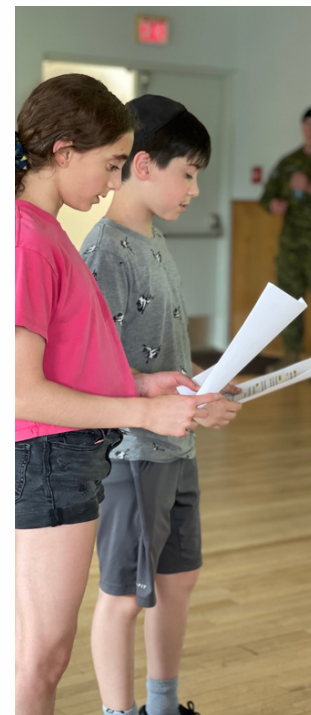
In August 2021, a bronze statue of Anne Frank was erected in Light House Park commemorating Canada's role in liberating the Netherlands from Nazi tyranny. The Dutch Canadian Club commissioned the statue of Anne Frank, which is a replica of a work done in 1960 by Dutch sculptor Pieter d'Hont and installed in the city of Utrecht, Netherlands. As of May 5, 2023, it has been 78 years since our Canadian soldiers helped liberate towns and cities in France, Belgium and the Netherlands.

Members of Jewish Federation of Edmonton's Holocaust Education Committee, including CEO Stacey Leavitt Wright, Valda Levin, and Frances Cyngiser, also participated in the meaningful and moving ceremony. John Stobbe of the Dutch Canadian Club of Edmonton led the event, along with the South Alberta Light Horse Regiment.

Each of our students placed a flower on or around the Anne Frank bronze statue. Following the ceremony, attendees walked to the Connaught Armory where our students read quotes and other information about Anne Frank. Here is a sampling:

- **Max & James:** Anne Frank. A hero to the Dutch and Jewish communities, a leader forced into hiding, a great person, whose life was cut short by the Nazis. The later years of her life were plunged in misery, but she always had hope and faith in human kindness. A quote from her now famous diary states, *"I simply can't build my hopes on a foundation of confusion, misery and death...I think...peace and tranquility will return again"*.
- **Mara & Shai:** Here are a few more quotes from Anne Frank's writings that we found inspirational and can be great life-advance for everyone: "In spite of everything, I still believe that people are really good at heart." "As long as this exists, this sunshine and this cloudless sky, and as long as I can enjoy it, how can I be said?"

A huge thanks to the Jewish Federation of Edmonton for sponsoring the cost of the school bus that brought our students to the event.

Rabbi Guy Tal was born and raised in Israel. He learned in Yeshivat Kefar Haroe'e, Yeshivat Dimona and Yeshivat Har HaMor, and also served in the Israeli Defense Forces. He has worked as a Rabbi and educator over the last 17 years in Venezuela, Mexico, Greece and Israel. He earned his BEd in education from michlala (college) of Bait Vagan, his MA in Jewish Studies from the Hebrew University of Mexico, and recently his PhD in History of Ideas from the Pan-American University in Mexico City. He has smicha from the principal rabbinate in Israel. Rabbi Guy also published two books with commentary on Rav Kook's "Orot". Rabbi Guy believes that the future of the Jewish community in Edmonton depends on its Jewish education, and that knowledge of the Torah and the tradition must be taught from early age until the last day. His own children attend AJP and are loving the program!

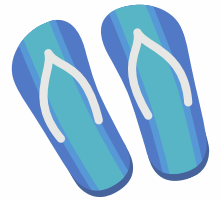

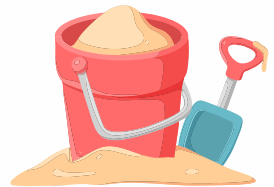
